

CAREER RESEARCH REPORT

(To be used in conjunction with the assessment developed for Standard 5A.I)

Performance Standard 5B.I

Each student will analyze the information gathered for the career report from 5A.I and will select the information to include in the report, based on the criteria for determining accurate and appropriate evidence accordingly:

- *Analyzing sources:* analyze sources found and select for inclusion those that meet the requirements for accuracy, currency and reliability; find acceptable sources.
- *Developing works cited/bibliography:* format entries on the works cited/bibliography list; arrange entries in alphabetical order; include corresponding parenthetical notation(s) in the text of the report.
- *Recording parenthetical notation:* include correct information; insert properly into the text; punctuate properly.

Procedures

1. ***In order to analyze and evaluate information acquired from various sources (5B)***, students should experience sufficient learning opportunities to develop the following:
 - Analyze and evaluate information.
 - Use criteria (e.g., accuracy, currency, reliability) to evaluate primary and secondary sources (e.g., juried article, edited text, reputation of author/publisher).
 - Cite the source(s) of all direct quotations and paraphrased/summarized information.
 - Develop a bibliography and a source(s) cited page using an appropriate format.The ability to utilize various information gathered through research techniques is important. Not all information is appropriate for the intended use. Students enrolled in Family and Consumer Sciences (FCS) classes who explore career areas of interest must be able to apply this skill in analyzing research collected. Students will meet the FCS Education National Standards, Reasoning for Action standards 5.2 (Judge validity and reliability of information, sources, opinions and evidence) and 5.3 (Give reasons based on scientific principles, observations and evidence).
2. Have FCS students review and discuss the assessment task and how the rubric will be used to evaluate their work.
3. The class will brainstorm criteria for reliability, currency and accuracy of information.
4. The student will be familiar with proper formatting of works cited/bibliography entries (e.g., APA, MLA) to be used in this project.
5. The student will be familiar with proper formatting of parenthetical notation (e.g., APA, MLA) to be used in this project.
6. The student will develop a bibliography of sources for the research report assignment, using all available resources, both print and non-print.
7. The student will evaluate each source of information according to the criteria for reliability, currency and accuracy and will discard any sources that do not meet those criteria.
8. The student will develop proper works cited/bibliography entries for each acceptable source, using the designated format.
9. The student will develop the proper parenthetical notation entry (placement in text, required information, punctuation) for each block of evidence/data used in the research report, using the designated format.
10. Evaluate each student's performance using the rubric. Add each student's scores to determine the performance level.
